Mass. turns green this St. Patrick's Day

overnor Deval Patrick has declared March 2014 as Irish Heritage Month in Massachusetts, and everywhere you turn there are green events sprouting up through the snow and ice that lingers on the landscape.

Here is an overview of some of the best events taking place in Massachusetts and across the New England region.

MUSIC IN MASS.

The Dropkick Murphys, Boston's favorite punk-Irish band, is lifting the rafters at the House of Blues on Lansdowne Street, on March 13-17. Fans travel from all over the country to rock out with the harddriving, rambunctious, fun-loving band in their home town.

St. Patrick's Celtic Sojourn concerts, hosted by Corkman Brian O'Donovan, whose popular radio show Celtic Sojourn runs Saturdays on WGBH. Now in its 9th year the lineup features two acts from Ireland - the Alan Kelly Gang and Irish trad duo Caitlin nic Gabhann and Ciaran o Maonaigh, plus Galician piping master Carlos Nunez.

The concerts take place at the Hanover Theatre in Worcester on March 14, then head over to the Sanders Theatre in Harvard Square for shows on March 15 & 16.

Master fiddler Seamus Connolly headlines the Reagle Theatre of Greater Boston's annual "A Bit of Ireland" concert on March 15-16 in Waltham, along with members of Boston's Comhaltas Chapter, led by the Reynolds brothers.

champion Liam Harney brings his award winning academy to perform.

The Irish Cultural Centre in Canton is offering a full schedule of Irish music, pub sessions and other family activities, from March 14-17.

The fun, retro-ballad singing, punk trad band Tin Can Hooley performs at the Canadian American Club in Watertown on March 14. On March 15, the JFK Library in Dorchester features a free performance by Maureen Green O'Leary School of Irish Dancing.

On March 19, singer/fiddler Sharon Corr plays at the hip Brighton Music Hall in Boston's Allston/Brighton neighborhood, and across the river in Somerville, Galway singer Sean Keane performs at the Burren Pub in Davis Square.

On March 23, the Irish A Rovers from Dublin are giving their farewell Boston-area concert at Carey Hall in Lexington.

MUSIC AROUND NEW ENGLAND

On March 16, the Blackstone River Theatre in Cumberland, RI features the popular Celtic band Pendragon, and on March 16 they bring in three Celtic harpists, including Patrick Ball. On March 16 Irish band Gypsy
